

Five Years in Our New Home

At 6:30am on September 15, 2016, every staff member at Ministry with Community stood in the Commons Area of our brand-new facility at 500 North Edwards Street. Full of excitement and anticipation, we unlocked the doors and welcomed our members in for the first time. As the space filled, there were smiles, cheers, fists raised in joy, hugs, and high fives. In that moment, the hard work that went into fundraising, designing, and constructing the new building was all worth it.

It's hard to believe, but that joyful moment was five years ago. In the time since, we have grown a thriving garden where we have harvested more than 2,000 pounds of fresh produce for our kitchen. Members have washed 92,776 loads of laundry in our 6 washers and dryers. 67,789 showers have been taken in our spacious and accessible private shower stalls.

An abundance of natural light has poured in through our many windows. Extra office spaces have been utilized by numerous outreach organizations to meet with members onsite. The loading dock and staging area have allowed us to safely receive large donations and keep meal costs reasonable, and so much more.

The list of advantages offered by the new space are endless, but a few features have proven to be essential in ways we never planned for.

"I don't know how we would have navigated the pandemic in our old building," says Kelly Henderson, Executive Director. "The layout and space in our current facility have afforded so many efficiencies and safety options."

When physical distancing became a must in March 2020, the extra 9,800 square feet of space we now have meant that more people could be indoors, safely using our services. The Welcome Desk, a booth positioned directly in front of the entrance where volunteers would greet and assist members,

became the perfect spot for our Security Team to do temperature checks and hand out clean masks to all who came through our doors. Even our HVAC system contributed to our safety with its ability to bring in more fresh, outdoor air and allow for special filters that trap the virus and other airborne particles. This building was a major factor in our ability to remain open and serving our community during the pandemic.

While we wouldn't trade a moment in our beautiful new home for anything, we haven't forgotten our old facility or the incredible impact it had on so many lives.

"All of my memories of the old building are good," says Gwen Lanier, Recovery Support Specialist. "That's where I got to step back into the real world and rebuild my life."

Gwen started out washing dishes in our kitchen in 1992. "I kept working my way up to new positions and they helped me get my GED. Now, here I am, helping others rebuild their lives. It's really a privilege."

Though her memories of the old building are good, Gwen emphasizes that our new facility is much better suited for serving our members. "Because we have more space here, we can offer more programs and really personalize the type of outreach we provide. There is also much more privacy in the Social Work wing and that is key to helping people, especially those seeking recovery from substance use."

Gwen also notes that the atmosphere in our current space is a major improvement. "There is music playing over the speakers and plenty of sunshine coming in through the windows. It's much more open and welcoming. And after more than 20 years, I finally have a window in my office," she says with a laugh.

To ensure that we preserve this incredible space, we have a full-time Facilities Coordinator. Phil Behrens came to us with decades of valuable experience and keeps things running smoothly, from mechanical issues to paint touch-ups to landscaping.
